<u>Virology Sampling for the 2025-26 Winter Season</u>

A big thanks to our virology sampling practices for your participation this winter. This season, our priority patient groups are: under 5 year olds, over 75 year olds, and pregnant patients. It would also be wonderful if patients who have received a flu and/or RSV vaccination this season are prioritised for sampling.

Our Take-A-Test-UK patient self-swabbing pathway is a great way to encourage all of your patients to request a swab kit at the earliest signs of flu. You can promote this on your websites and social media - https://takeatestuk.com/. Please include your ODS practice code in your promotion of the pathway, as patients are required to enter this as the mandatory 'Voucher code'. Patients will also need to enter their NHS number to request a self-swab kit.
