

As well as highlighting members of our team, we would also like to resume highlighting the practices in our network and showcasing their contributions.



The relationship between Woodstock Bower Group Practice and the RSC has continued to grow and strengthen over time. We have benefited greatly from close communication, shared innovation, and a willingness to explore new ways of working, all of which have provided a strong springboard for further studies. This has included involvement in website testing and the development of new approaches to virology research.

Our participation in the OBSERVATARI and RAPTOR studies significantly improved both clinical workflow and the care delivered to patients, particularly at a time when anxiety around viral risks was high. These projects enabled us to integrate research seamlessly into routine care while maintaining patient reassurance and safety.

It has been both an honour and a pleasure working with the RSC. In particular, we would like to acknowledge and thank the practice liaison team, who we have worked closely with and could always rely on for guidance and support. Our joint projects, including asymptomatic sampling and paediatric phlebotomy, have further enhanced the quality of care we are able to provide to our patient population.
