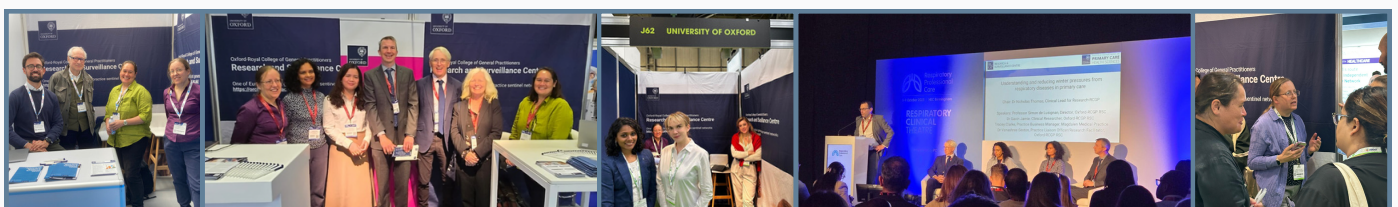

We wish him, and his tomatoes, all the best.

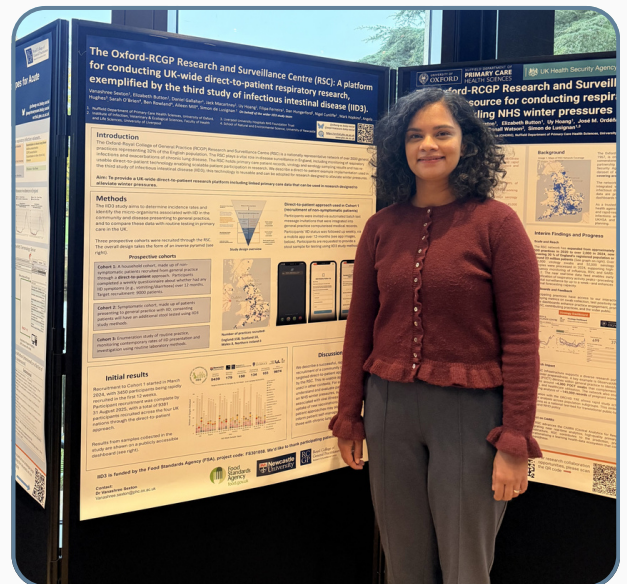


Dr Vanashree Sexton wins Best Poster at CARRii Conference
